Bringing Spiritual Development and Transformation into Modern Healthcare Education

Year 1: Teaching about Reincarnation

September 9–11, 2023 at the Goetheanum, Dornach, Switzerland

Dear colleagues in all medical professions,

whether you are new to teaching about anthroposophic therapies or have long experience in training situations, we invite you to join us for a new cycle of the medical section's *Teach the Teacher (TTT)* program. This three-year course provides opportunity for therapeutic, nursing and medical trainers, both new and experienced, to learn from each other. The goal is to:

- deepen our own teaching skills
- learn new tools
- gain confidence and flexibility
- build and mutually support each other in community

September 2023 marks the beginning of a new cycle after several years' pause.

For each of the next three years, each TTT conference will center on a topic that can be particularly challenging to teach in modern education settings. This September we will ask:

- How can we teach about reincarnation?
- How can we be creative when we speak about deep spiritual content to meet new learners needs?

Each year's theme will then also be explored through a specific educational process. For this year we will focus on the process of requesting and sharing **feedback**. Specific questions include:

- What are good models and research about feedback? What can we learn from others?
- What helps engage and encourage adult learners?
- What can we learn from the experiences of teaching in different cultures, in different parts of the world?
- Where are people being particularly innovative and creative in their approach?

Basic Principles in Education is a third pillar of the program and it will be addressed with emphasis on how to connect to the "I" in the learning process.

The Teach the Teachers program focuses on collegial exchange and learning-by-doing. This includes exercises, small group work, movement, artistic work, dialogue walks and peerteaching practice. Every participant will be actively engaged, with time to both practice and reflect on their own teaching approaches.

This fall's conference is being prepared by a multi-disciplinary group, with members from ten different countries and four continents. Please join us!
